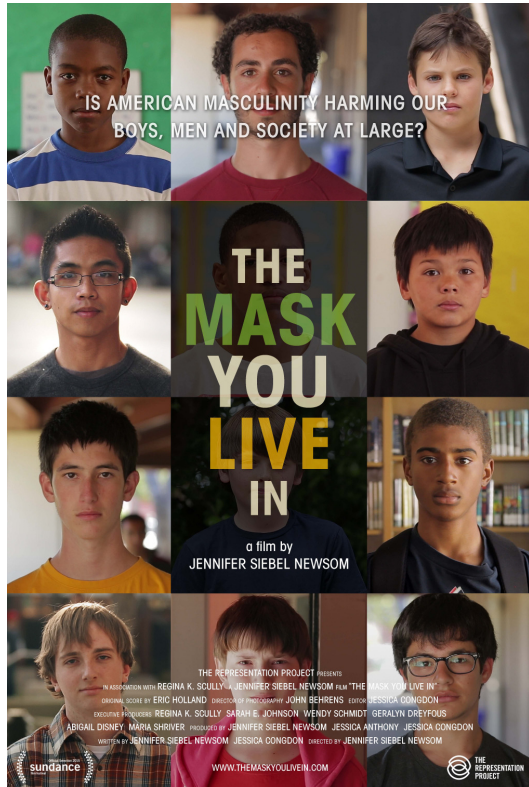


In recognition of May being National Mental Health Month,
